**Purpose of Report:** To consult on the draft general fund revenue and capital budgets.

# 1 SUMMARY

- 1.1 The committee will be aware that there have been a number of reports during the course of this year on both the current budget and that proposed for 2011/12.
- 1.2 During these meetings, the Overview and Scrutiny Committees considered a number of savings proposals and these have been, in the main, agreed by Cabinet in November 2010.
- 1.3 Having agreed these, Cabinet then considered a further report in December 2010 that agreed for consultation a number of assumptions and also introduced the capital programme bids and likely resources. This report is included at appendix 1.

# 2 **RECOMMENDATIONS**:

- 2.1 That the Overview and Scrutiny Committee consider the assumptions, including those on prudential borrowing, and that the minutes, recording the discussion, be included in the budget report to Cabinet in February 2011;
- 2.2 That the Overview and Scrutiny Committee comment on the principal of reporting back to Full Council should the 2011/12 budget not be contained within an overspend of £0.5m; and
- 2.3 That the Overview and Scrutiny Committee forward any comment on the capital resource assumptions and bids to the Cabinet meeting in February 2011.

# 3 CABINET PROPOSALS

- 3.1 At their meeting on 8 December 2010, the Cabinet agreed the report and recommendations, as set out in the attached report at appendix 1.
- 3.2 The report is now being issued to the Overview and Scrutiny Committees for consultation and the feedback will be considered by Cabinet at their meeting in February 2011 in formalising their budget recommendations to Full Council later in that month.

#### 4 THE MEDIUM TERM FINANCIAL FORECAST AND GOVERNMENT GRANT ANNOUNCEMENT

- 4.1 The Committee will be aware that the government announcement on the proposed grant settlement was only issued on 13 December 2010. The nature of the announcement and the amount of changes to grant regimes that this introduced has required a longer than normal time to be required to calculate the impact on the Council. This has had the unfortunate affect of delaying reports and officers apologise for this inconvenience.
- 4.2 The result is an estimated reduction of £7.153m. Members should be aware that this is a best estimate on the basis of the information disclosed from government departments to date and our interpretation of the announcements.
- 4.3 Due to the work that has been carried out in identifying savings proposals, the current forecast for the remaining deficit for 2011/12 stands at just £0.739m. Although still a sizeable sum, this should be seen as positive due to the work and savings already achieved. The revised MTFF is included as appendix 2.

# 5 IMPACT ON CORPORATE POLICIES, PRIORITIES, PERFORMANCE AND COMMUNITY IMPACT
