Purpose of Report: To outline progress against the PCT's delivery of /QIPP schemes for 2011/12.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to provide an update in relation to progress made against QIPP schemes during 2011/12 to date (See **Appendix 1** for a detailed QIPP progress report).

2. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND:

2.1 QIPP is the acronym used in the NHS to describe the approach to successfully deliver national and local service and quality objectives within the anticipated future funding constraints. QIPP is made up of four interlinked elements: Quality, Innovation, Productivity and Prevention. Together they will enable the NHS to deliver on its vision for change and improvement, whilst maintaining the quality and range of services people want and need.

Taking into account the current and future needs of the population and the financial constraints, the system has identified a number of opportunities for service redesign that we believe offer scope to deliver better care and outcomes for less direct investment. Key areas are:

- Older people we are working to improve the outcomes for older people and enhance and improve service delivery.
- Admission Avoidance by providing care closer to home and alternatives modalities of treatment we can reduce the number of people requiring an urgent admission and care in hospital.

- Long term conditions by promoting more effective methods of self-care and improving our capability and pathways to support people with long term conditions, we will reduce primary care and acute costs and improve outcomes for patients.
- Outpatient referrals and follow ups by investing in primary care, we will further develop our shared care arrangements and improve the way we share data.
- Mental health services by better understanding the needs of the population and enhancing our care pathways, we will reduce the demand for intensive high cost interventions and unnecessary prescribing of certain costly or harmful medication.
- Children by better antenatal support to mothers and the further development of appropriate pathways for children and young people to get timely intervention or support for identified mental, physical or behavioural problems.

In terms of monitoring progress against QIPP, on a monthly basis as part of preparing the monthly financial performance report, the PCT prepares a forecast delivery of QIPP schemes. The total value of the savings identified for 2011/12 is denoted below for South Essex against forecast achievement year to date
