Local, Visible, Accessible Policing

Increased investment in visible policing

- 215 extra officers in 2019/2020 funded by an increase of £2 per month (per band D property)
- 150 extra officers recruited in 2018/2019
- Reaching a total of 3200 officers by April 2020

Public opinion

- November 2018 asked residents if they are willing to invest more in policing
 - 4000 responses
 - 71% said yes
 - 72% willing to invest £20
 or more





Local, Visible, Accessible Policing

Extra Officers from 2018/19 funding increase

- 6 PCs for Community Policing Team
- 6 PCs for Local Policing Team
- 3 officers for the Domestic Violence Unit

Thurrock Council supported team and activity

- Team of 1 Sgt, 8 PCs.
 - 1 Sgt and 5 PCs funded by Council
- Operation Caesar
 - Disruption of nuisance motorbikes
- Operation Raptor
 - Additional anti gang activity
- Anti Social Behaviour
 - Additional activity across Thurrock

Gangs and Violence



- Joint operations and interventions from Essex Police, the Youth Offending Service and other agencies
- Sharing intelligence and data to improve targeting
- Increased investment in awareness and education programmes
- New, evidence-based interventions to prevent young people from being exploited by criminal gangs.

- Additional £664,000 from the national Early Intervention Fund
- Tackle the complex issues of serious violence, youth exploitation and drug gangs
- Establish a Violence and Vulnerability Unit.






Joint Governance – Essex County Fire and Rescue Service

Essex County Fire and Rescue Service

- Change in governance Oct 2017 ٠
- Only 31% of incidents attended over the last five ٠ years were fires
- Significant reduction in number of fires in the last ٠ ten years (Graph)
- Statutory duty to collaborate with other emergency services (Police and Crime Act Jan 2017)
- Development of Fire and Rescue Plan 2019-2024 ٠
