## Executive Summary

The following report provides the background and details supporting a decision to endorse Thurrock Council's representations to government on the proposed expansion of Directions.

As part of the representation period ending on 7 February, interest parties are able to comment on the Directions the Secretary of State is 'minded-to' implement following the receipt of the Commissioners' first report and the interim findings of the Best Value Inspection.

### 1. Recommendation(s)

**1.1 That General Services Committee comment on the letter of representations at Appendix 2 for submission to the Department of Levelling-up, Housing and Communities.**

### 2. Introduction and Background

2.1 On 2 September 2022, the then Secretary of State announced a package of Intervention for Thurrock Council, including appointing Essex County Council as Commissioners.

2.2 At the same time, Essex County Council were appointed as Best Value Inspectors, to ascertain as to whether Thurrock Council was failing to comply with its Best Value Duty.

2.3 The Department of Levelling-up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC) required Essex County Council to provide a first report of the Commissioner within

three months and the Best Value Inspection report was required within four months.

- 2.4 The Best Value Inspection team wrote to DLUHC ahead of their deadline to request more time to conduct the inspection and to provide an update letter on their findings. This request was approved, and the Best Value Inspection report will now be submitted in full to the Department by 17 February 2023.

### **3. Issues, Options and Analysis of Options**

- 3.1 On 24 January, the Department wrote to Thurrock Council outlining that the Secretary of State was 'minded-to' expand the Directions in response to the Best Value Inspection update letter and the Commissioners' First Report.

- 3.2 The letter containing the proposed Directions has been provided with this report at appendix 1, and can also be found at <https://www.gov.uk/government/collections/intervention-at-thurrock-council> along with the all other documents DLUHC has published relating to the Intervention.

- 3.3 As stated in the letter, the Secretary of State intends to publish new Directions following a period of representations. All interested parties are able to submit representations, which will be considered ahead of the Secretary of State making their final decision. The deadline for representations is 7 February.

- 3.4 The response on behalf of Thurrock Council can be found at appendix 2 and the submission of a Thurrock Council representation does not preclude any individual or group associated with the organisation from submitting separate representations to DLUHC should they wish.

### **4. Reasons for Recommendation**

- 4.1 The recommendation provides for Members to endorse the representations made from Thurrock Council to officials within the Department.
