#### **Executive Summary**

An application has been received to vary the premises licence at Thurrock Rugby Club, Long Lane, Grays, RM16 2QH. A representation has been received from a local resident.

#### 1. Recommendation(s)

#### 1.1 That the Sub-Committee

a) Considers this report and appendices together with any oral submissions at the hearing and determines the application to vary the premises licence in line with the options open to the committee under the Licensing Act 2003.

#### 2. Introduction and Background

- 2.1 On 14 June 2022, an application to vary the premises licence at Thurrock Rugby Club, Long Lane Grays, was submitted by Stuart Hughes. A copy of the full application and associated documentation is attached as **Appendix 1**.
- 2.2 The application is to add the licensable activities of boxing and wrestling entertainment (12 midday 11pm) and recorded music (5pm 11pm) outside on Pitch 1, Friday and Saturday for up to 850 people.

The premises is currently licensed for regulated entertainment (not including boxing and wrestling) and supply of alcohol 8am - midnight Monday to

Thursday and 8am – 1am Friday - Sunday. A copy of the existing premises licence including the current conditions is attached as **Appendix 2**.

- 2.3 During the consultation, a representation has been received from local residents, and this is attached at **Appendix 3**.
- 2.4 Essex Police submitted a request for conditions to be added to the licence should the variation be granted. A copy of the requested conditions is attached at **Appendix 4**.
- 2.5 No representations were received from any other persons or Responsible Authorities.
- 2.6 Under the Licensing Act 2003 the licensing objectives are
  - (a) the prevention of crime and disorder;
  - (b) public safety;
  - (c) the prevention of public nuisance; and
  - (d) the protection of children from harm.
- 2.7 Any representation must relate to a particular premises and must be relevant to the promotion of one or more of the four licensing objectives.

#### 3. Issues, Options and Analysis of Options

- 3.1 The following options are available to the Licensing Sub-Committee:
  - To grant the variation as applied for;
  - To grant the application subject to such conditions as are necessary and proportionate to promote the licensing objectives; or
  - To refuse the application.
- 3.2 In determining this application for a variation of the premises licence, the Sub-Committee should have regard to the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and to the guidance issued by the Secretary of State under s182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 3.3 Section 2 of the statutory guidance relates to the four licensing objectives and may be relevant to this application.
- 3.4 The Sub-Committee are advised that the hearing is a statutory exercise of power delegated by local residents to consider what the public interest requires. The licensing authority, via the Sub-Committee, has a duty, in accordance with the rule of law, to behave fairly in the decision-making procedure. Representations from all parties both written and verbal will form

part of matters that are to be considered. Findings on issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.

- 3.5 The Sub-Committee are advised that the final decision should be based on the individual merits of the application and findings of fact made at the hearing.
- 3.6 The application must be determined within 5 working days of the conclusion of the hearing, in accordance with paragraph 26 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.




- a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

(ii)drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); .

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; .

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; .

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise antisocial behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; .

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

- 4 The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5 (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

- 6 The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider:  $\frac{1}{2}$  pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and,
- (ii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and .

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

7 (1). A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

(2).For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula where-

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

(3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 3 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

(4) (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the price permitted on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales and supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this licence shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendations made

a) By the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) where the film has been classified by that Board, or

b) By the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or, where the licensing authority has notified the licence holder that section 20 (3) (b) (74 (3)9b) for clubs) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.

## Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1 The premises shall have installed and maintain a closed circuit television surveillance (CCTV) system which at all times complies with the below requirements:
  - CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition;
  - CCTV cameras shall cover all public areas including all entrances and exits and all areas where the sale of alcohol takes place;
  - Equipment must be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings must be kept in good working order and kept for a minimum of 28 days;
  - At all times, whilst the premises is open for licensable activities, there are members of staff able to immediately provide viewable copies of recordings to the police or licensing authority staff upon reasonable request;
  - The recording equipment and data storage devices shall be kept in a secure environment and fitted with security functions (such as passwords) to prevent recordings being tampered with;
  - An operational daily log report must be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked and is compliant. In the event of any failure this will be recorded immediately.
- 2 Any failure of the CCTV system which cannot be rectified within 24 hours of discovery must be reported to the central Essex Police Licensing Team by phone or email (contact details as per Essex Police website).
- 3 Signs must be displayed at all entrances (and exits) advising customers that CCTV is operating at the premises and shall be a minimum size of 200 x 148 mm and clearly legible at all times when the premises conducts licensable activities.

With reference to the above, we write to you to express our concerns with respect to this application

We can see the application goes someway to highlight the proposed changes which we feel, will have a very adverse effect to our residency in Long Lane and localised area, which could definitely and significantly affect our relatively peaceful current status, detailed below

We have been quite happy residents of Long Lane for approx. 8>9 years now and although we have had to experience some problematic nuisances through our time here, things are generally good

When we moved here, we quickly realised that this particular section of Long Lane was very quiet, especially during evenings and night time periods

The problems we can see with this particular application are as follows:

 Significant increase in traffic and pedestrian movements, in particular the periods mentioned in the application (venue also stated as being able to accommodate >850 persons!)

- 2) Potential noise and disruptive nuisance created by "late leavers" who will either walk or who will drive from the venue along this stretch of Long Lane back into Blackshots Lane and Stifford Clays estate; and once the toilet facilities are closed at the venue, what will be the result...
- 3) Serious audible nuisance from the numerous tannoy announcements and intermittent music being played over quite a long, significant duration. As the event is to be held in the open air, we believe we will definitely be exposed and subjected to this problem

These are our main observations and form the basis of our strong objections against this proposal

We suggest an open-air event of this nature and duration will not be particularly suitable for this venue, especially when on a long term, planned weekly/regular basis Going further, if approved, we believe it will quickly become very

unpopular with many local residents

Local facilities, such as the Civic Hall for example, could be much better suited and easily facilitate this type of show as a possible irregular or monthly event, and which might help make use of the venue whilst improving the popularity of the facilities that Thurrock could offer

We hope the above will be given due consideration with regards this application

I am writing on behalf of Essex Police as the responsible Licensing Officer for the Thurrock Council area.

I have considered the application for a full variation at the premises detailed below, in considering this application I have considered the history of the premises from a policing prospective and the licensable activities being requested as part of the extension of the Premises Licence. Essex Police has some concerns regarding crime and disorder linked to the licensable activity being sought, I have held discussions with the applicant and have agreed the following conditions to be added to the license as part of this variation:

- 1. Essex Police shall be provided with 28 days' notice where an event is to be held which is organised by an external promoter or is promoted/advertised to the public by an external promoter and where that event includes boxing, wrestling, mixed martial arts or similar. This notice shall include full details of the nature of the event and the promoter, expected attendee numbers and the details of each fighter listed on the bill.
- 2. The notice shall be e-mailed to the central police licensing team (the address of which appears on the Essex Police website).

- 3. Where SIA licensed door supervisors are used at the premises a record shall be maintained (on the premises) which is legible and details:
  - a. The day and date when door supervisors were deployed
  - b. The name and SIA registration number of each door supervisor on duty at the premises
  - c. The start and finish time of each door supervisor's worked duty period.

This record shall be retained on the premises for 31 days and be immediately provided to police or licensing authority staff upon reasonable request.

- 4. All SIA licensed door supervisors engaged at the premises for the purpose of supervising or controlling queues must wear high visibility jackets or vests. When boxing, wrestling, mixed martial arts or similar takes place at the venue all SIA door supervisors on duty will wear high visibility jackets or vests.
- 5. When boxing, wrestling, mixed martial arts or similar takes place at the venue drinks must only be served in polycarbonate/plastic and/or toughened glass containers.
- 6. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made immediately available to police or licensing authority staff upon reasonable request.

The log must be completed as soon as is possible and within any case within 4 hours of the occurrence and shall record the following:

- a. all crimes reported to the venue
- b. all ejections of patrons
- c. any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
- d. any incidents of disorder
- e. all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- f. any faults in a CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment mandated as a condition of the licence

The incident log shall either be electronic or maintained in a bound document with individually numbered pages and be retained for at least {12} months from the date of the last entry.

- 7. A Challenge 25 scheme shall be operated, whereby any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years of age is required to produce on request an item which meets the mandatory age verification requirement (photo, name, date of birth and either a holographic mark or ultraviolet feature) and is either a:
  - a. Proof of age card bearing the PASS Hologram;
  - b. Photocard driving licence;
  - c. Passport; or
  - d. Ministry of Defence Identity Card.
- 8. The premises shall clearly display signs at the each point of sale and in areas where alcohol is displayed advising customers that a 'Challenge 25' policy is in force.

At the point of sale, such signs shall be a minimum size of 200mm x 148mm.
