Breaching those parts identified as a pecuniary interest is potentially a criminal offence

Helpful Reminders for Members

- *In particular have you declared to the Monitoring Officer all disclosable pecuniary interests?*
- *Have you checked the register to ensure that they have been recorded correctly?*

When should you declare an interest *at a meeting*?

- **What matters are being discussed at the meeting?** (including Council, Cabinet, Committees, Subs, Joint Committees and Joint Subs); or
- If you are a Cabinet Member making decisions other than in Cabinet **what matter is before you for single member decision?**



Does the business to be transacted at the meeting

What is a Non-Pecuniary interest? – this is an interest which is not pecuniary (as defined) but is nonetheless so significant that a member of the public with knowledge of the relevant facts, would reasonably regard to be so significant that it would materially impact upon your judgement of the public interest.

If the interest is not already in the register you must (unless the interest has been agreed by the Monitoring Officer to be sensitive) disclose the existence and nature of the interest to the meeting

If the Interest is not entered in the register and is not the subject of a pending notification you must within 28 days notify the Monitoring Officer of the interest for inclusion in the register

Unless you have received dispensation upon previous application from the Monitoring Officer, you must:

- **Not participate or participate further in any discussion of the matter at a meeting;**
- **Not participate in any vote or further vote taken at the meeting; and**
- **leave the room while the item is being considered/voted upon**

Executive Summary

An application has been received for a summary review of the premises licence in respect of **Banjo, 54-60 Maidstone Road, Grays, RM17 6NF**. This hearing is to consider any Interim Steps necessary to be taken

1. RECOMMENDATIONS:

1.1 The Sub-Committee considers the application for summary review and whether it is necessary to take interim steps

2. Introduction and Background:

2.1 Summary reviews can be undertaken when the police consider that the premises concerned are associated with serious crime or serious disorder (or both). The summary review process, set out under sections 53A-53D of the 2003 Act, allows interim conditions to be quickly attached to a licence and a fast track licence review

2.2 Within 48 hours of receipt of the chief officer's application, the licensing authority must give the premises licence holder and responsible authorities a notice of the review and should include a copy of the application for review and a copy of the certificate and must also consider whether it is necessary to take interim steps (place temporary conditions on the licence).

2.3 If the licensing authority decides to take steps at the initial interim stage:

- The decision takes place immediately, or as soon after it as the licensing authority directs; but

- The licensing authority must give immediate notice of its decision and its reasons for doing so to the holder of the premises licence and the chief officer of police who made the application.
- 2.4 This hearing is to decide on necessary interim steps only. A full review of this premises licence will take place within 28 days from the date of receipt of this application.
- 2.5 A copy of the current premises licence for Banjo, 54-60 Maidstone Road, Grays, RM17 6NF is attached as **Appendix 1**

3. The Application:

- 3.1 On the 27 July 2012 at 16:16hrs, an application for a Summary Review was received from Simon Barnes, Licensing Officer, on behalf of the chief of police for Essex.
- 3.2 The application relates to an incident at the premises on the evening of Thursday 14 July 2022, whereby a customer was allegedly assaulted with an offensive weapon by the manager. The manager then closed the premises and left the scene. The Police had to obtain a court warrant to enter the premises and seize the CCTV. A full copy of the application is attached as **Appendix 2**.
- 3.3 Essex Police as part of their application are requesting that the premises licence is suspended as an interim step until the full review hearing

4. Reasons for Recommendation:

- 4.1 The following interim steps that the licensing authority can take are:
- the modification of the conditions of the premises licence;
 - the exclusion of a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - the removal of the designated premises supervisor from the licence;
 - the suspension of the licence

Modification of the conditions of the premises licence can include the alteration or modification of existing conditions or addition of any new conditions, including those that restrict the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.

The decision takes effect immediately, or as soon after it as the licensing authority directs.

5. Consultation (including Overview and Scrutiny, if applicable)

- 5.1 There is no requirement to consult with this stage of the application under the Licensing Act 2003. The Licence holder has been invited to attend this hearing. This hearing may take place in their absence and without an invite being extended to attend. The licence holder does have the ability to make

representations in relation to any interim steps at a later stage, which must be considered by the sub-committee if made.

6. Impact on corporate policies, priorities, performance and community impact

6.1 Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 places a duty on local authorities to do all that it can to prevent –

- (a) crime and disorder in its area (including anti-social behaviour and other behaviour adversely affecting the local community), and;
- (b) the misuse of drugs, alcohol and other substances in its areas.

In considering this application in relation to these duties the authority should have due regard to Section 61(1) (b) Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, Thurrock Council's guidelines on previous convictions or cautions and any submissions made by the applicant.

I am giving this certificate because I am of the opinion that other procedures under the Licensing Act 2003 are inappropriate because;

On Thursday 14th July 2022 at 18:00hrs

A serious assault on a customer involving an offensive weapon (knuckle duster) by the Premises manager has taken place outside of the premises known as Banjo's which is now calling itself The Club. This assault is alleged to have occurred after the victim had been drinking at the premises when the manager asked to speak to him outside the premises. The assault has taken place in the smoking area of the premises. The assault has been aggravated as it is alleged the manager has used a knuckleduster to attack victim. Following the attack the manager has locked the premises dismissed staff and fled the scene.

Police have attempted to contact the DPS/PLH on the licence, to gain entry to the premises to investigate and gain access to the CCTV. Despite making requests for support this has not been forthcoming and as such a Police were forced to attend court and obtain a search warrant to recover CCTV evidence.

A search of the premises was undertaken, during which the Premises' CCTV machines were seized. Whilst lawfully on the premises a cannister of CS gas, a prohibited item, was located.

The suspect has now been arrested & charged for this assault. In addition Essex Police are aware of a change of DPS to this suspect from the current premises license holder & DPS . The suspect has been charged with ABH section 47 Offences against the person act 1861 which if convicted carries a sentence at Crown court of 5 years imprisonment on first conviction. This matter is aggravated as a weapon (knuckle duster) was used .

This therefore is 'serious crimes' as set out within section 53A(4) of the Licensing Act 2003 which states a 'serious crime' has the same meaning as in the Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act 2000 (s81(2) and (3) and which defines a serious crime as one where a person who has attained the age of twenty-one and has no previous convictions could reasonably be expected to be sentenced to imprisonment for a term of three years or more (...) or includes the use of violence etc..

A brief description of why standard review processes are inappropriate e.g. degree of seriousness of the crime/disorder, past history of non-compliance etc. may be helpful but this is not a legal necessity for the issue of a certificate and will be outlined within any application for review, should one subsequently be applied for. Applications are usually sought when 'interim steps' are considered necessary before a review hearing takes place.

There is no requirement to list all occurrences or provide the detail of each occurrence; the sole requirement is that an honest opinion is held that the premise is associated with serious crime/disorder. A single incident may be the trigger for a certificate if it is serious enough. The issue of a certificate does not mean the police MUST apply for a review.

A search of the premises was undertaken, during which the Premises' CCTV machines were seized. Whilst lawfully on the premises a cannister of CS gas, a prohibited item, was located.

the suspect has now been arrested & charged for this assault Essex Police is also aware of an ongoing process to transfer control of the licence from the current PLH/DPS to the alleged suspect in the primary matter above.

It is the Police contention that the presence of a prohibited weapon on the premises undermines the Prevention of Crime and Disorder licensing objective.

Essex Police will produce further documentary or other information in support of this application ahead of the hearing and would ask the authority to take this into account as it may do under Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005. In accordance with paragraph 11.9 of the Statutory Guidance Essex Police may amplify its representation at the subsequent hearing.

At present the premises is still operating without a DPS or any management structure in place .

INTERIM STEPS SOUGHT BY ESSEX POLICE

Essex Police would invite the licensing sub-committee to suspend the premises licence as 'interim steps' ahead of a full hearing and provide an opportunity to the premises licence holder to work with the police to agree operating hours, conditions and operating procedures which may be brought forward at a full hearing for a sub-committee to consider.

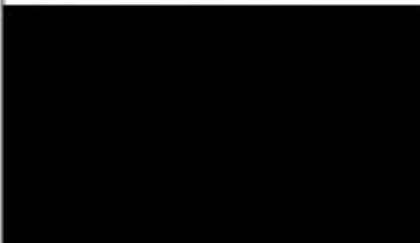

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- 1** No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
 - a)** At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of it or,
 - b)** At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2** Every supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3**
 - (1)** The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2)** In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a)** games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i)** drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or .
 - (ii)** drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); .
 - (b)** provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; .
 - (c)** provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; .
 - (d)** selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; .
 - (e)** dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

- 4 The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5 (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or .
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 6 The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and,
- (ii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and .
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."
- 7 (1). A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- (2).For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula

where-

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

(3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 3 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

(4) (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the price permitted on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

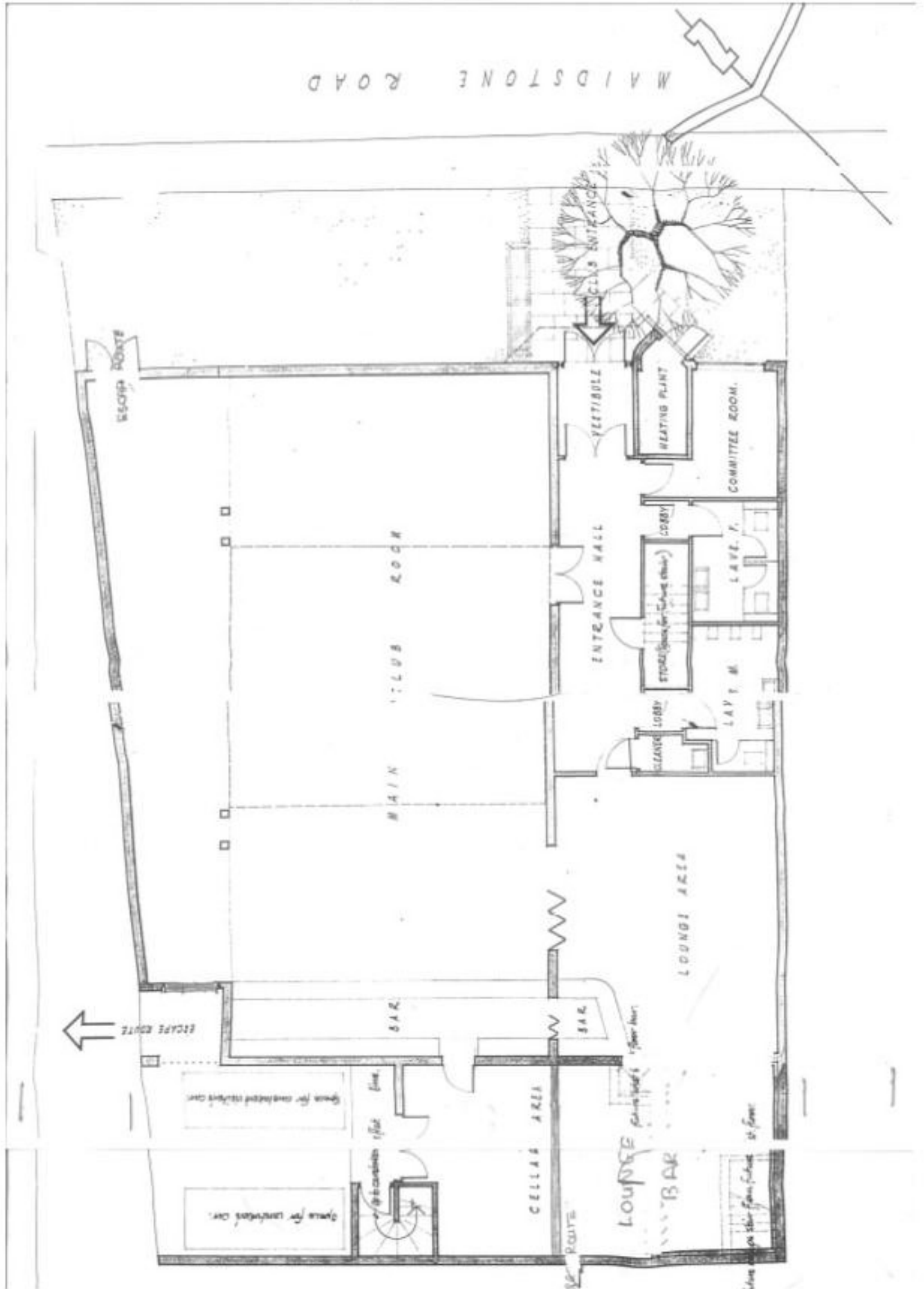
(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales and supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1 A CCTV system incorporating recording must operate throughout the whole of each period the premises is trading.**
- 2 The system will include coverage of all public entrances and exits from the premises and any other areas agreed with the Police.**
- 3 The system will provide for recording of all cameras simultaneously and recordings will be made for the whole of each period of trading.**
- 4 The recordings will be kept for a minimum period of 31 days before over recording and will be provided to the Police upon reasonable/lawful request.**
- 5 A Challenge 25 policy must be in operation at the premises and all staff must be trained in its operation. Any person who appears to be under the age of 25 must be asked for ID and the sale must be refused if they are unable to provide valid identification.**
- 6 Signage must be prominently displayed within the premises to advertise the fact that a Challenge 25 policy is in operation.**
- 7 The only acceptable forms of identification must be a photographic driving licence, passport or a "PASS" approved identification card.**
- 8 A refusals book must be used to record all sales of alcohol which are refused including the date, time, product, description of purchaser and reason for the refusal. All staff should be trained how to use it and the DPS or his appointed deputy will inspect and sign this at least once per week.**
- 9 The premises licence holder must ensure that ongoing staff training is provided in relation to age restricted products and such training will be provided at least once every six months.**
- 10 Written training records in relation to underage sales will be kept for all staff for the duration of their employment and for at least six months after the individual may leave employment. This must include signed and dated forms from the employees that state they have received and understood the training.**
- 11 No sale of alcohol will be made by any person who has not received training on age restricted products**
- 12 Prominent, clear and legible notices to be displayed at all exits asking patrons to leave the premises quietly and respect the needs of local residents.**
