#### Information for members of the public and councillors

#### **Access to Information and Meetings**

#### **Advice Regarding Public Attendance at Meetings:**

Following changes to government advice there is no longer a requirement for public attendees to book seats in advance of a committee meeting. All public attendees are expected to comply with the following points when physically attending a committee meeting:

- If you are a Cabinet Member making decisions other than in Cabinet what matter is before you for single member decision?

Disclosable Pecuniary Interests shall include your interests or those of:

- your spouse or civil partner's

A detailed description of a disclosable pecuniary interest is included in the Members Code of Conduct at Chapter 7 of the Constitution. Please seek advice from the Monitoring Officer about disclosable pecuniary interests.

What is a Non-Pecuniary interest? – this is an interest which is not pecuniary (as defined) but is nonetheless so significant that a member of the public with knowledge of the relevant facts, would reasonably regard to be so significant that it would materially impact upon your judgement of the public interest.

#### **Pecuniary**

If the interest is not already in the register you must (unless the interest has been agreed by the Monitoring Officer to be sensitive) disclose the existence and nature of the interest to the meeting

If the Interest is not entered in the register and is not the subject of a pending notification you must within 28 days notify the Monitoring Officer of the interest for inclusion in the register

Unless you have received dispensation upon previous application from the Monitoring Officer, you must:

- Not participate or participate further in any discussion of the matter at a meeting;
- Not participate in any vote or further vote taken at the meeting; and
- leave the room while the item is being considered/voted upon

If you are a Cabinet Member you may make arrangements for the matter to be dealt with by a third person but take no further steps

#### Non- pecuniary

Declare the nature and extent of your interest including enough detail to allow a member of the public to understand its nature

You may participate and vote in the usual way but you should seek advice on Predetermination and Bias from the Monitoring Officer.

#### **Executive Summary**

An objection has been received from Essex Police with regards to a Temporary Event notice submitted in relation to a Christmas carol concert at Grays Town Park Cafe. The objection relates to the licensing objective of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

#### 1. RECOMMENDATIONS:

1.1 The Sub-Committee considers this report and appendices together with any oral submissions at the hearing and determines the objection of a Temporary Event Notice

#### 2. Introduction and Background:

- 2.1 Section 104 (2) Licensing Act 2003, allows the Police or Environmental Health to object to a Temporary Event Notice if they believe that allowing the premises to be used in accordance with a Temporary Event Notice will undermine one or more of the licensing objectives.
- 2.2 The licensing objectives are:
- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

- 2.3 The Licensing Department received a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) on 16 November 2023 from Tina Holland for an event on 13 December 2023. A copy of the TEN is attached at **Appendix A**
- 2.4 The TEN relates to a Christmas carol concert with the sale of mulled wine to customers between 6:30pm 8:30pm for up to 40 people.
- 2.5 A letter of acknowledgement of the TEN was sent electronically on 16 November 2023 and a copy is attached at **Appendix B.**
- 2.6 On 21 November 2023 the Licensing Department received an Objection Notice from Simon Barnes, Licensing Officer with Essex Police, outlining his objection that the Police are satisfied that allowing the premises to be used in accordance with the notice would undermine the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective.

The reasons for being so satisfied are that the area to be used falls within the boundary of the Grays Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO).

A copy of the objection notice is attached at **Appendix C.** A copy of the PSPO is attached at **Appendix D.** 

2.7 No objection was received from Environmental Health.

#### 3. Issues, Options and Analysis of Options:

- 3.1 The committee, after considering the objection notice, will need to consider what action, if any, to take in order to ensure that the licensing objectives are complied with.
- 3.2 The power to impose the conditions from the premises licence on a TEN is conferred by s106 Licensing Act 2003. This is not a general power to impose conditions and can be exercised only where temporary events are held on premises, or parts of premises, for which a premises licence or Club Premises Certificate is in force and an objection notice is given.
- 3.3 The following options are available to the Licensing Sub-Committee:
  - Allow the Temporary Event Notice being determined as applied for;
  - To reject the Temporary Event Notice being determined as applied for and issue a Counter Notice, which will prevent the event from going ahead.
- 3.4 The decision made by the Committee will take immediate effect. There is a right of appeal for both the person who has given the TEN and for the relevant person that had submitted the objection notice. However, no appeal may be brought later than 5 working days before the day on which the event period specified in the TEN

- 3.5 In determining this application for an objection of the Temporary Event Notice by Essex Police, the Sub-Committee should have regard to the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and to the guidance issued by the Secretary of State under s182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 3.6 The Sub-Committee are advised that the hearing is of a quasi-judicial nature and representations from all parties both written and verbal will form part of matters that are to be considered. Findings on issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 3.7 The Sub-Committee are advised that the final decision should be based on the individual merits of the application & findings of fact made at the hearing
- 4. Reasons for Recommendation:
- 4.1 These are the options available to the Sub-Committee

- 5.1 A copy of the objection notice has been served on the premises user.

In considering this application in relation to these duties the authority should have due regard to Section 61(1) (b) Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, Thurrock Council's guidelines on previous convictions or cautions and any submissions made by the applicant.



# POLICE OBJECTION NOTICE To a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) Section 104 Licensing Act 2003

On 16<sup>th</sup> November 2023 Essex Police received the above Notice(s).

The Police are satisfied that the allowing the premises to be used in accordance with the notice(s) would undermine one or more of the licensing objectives.

The licensing objective(s) of relevance to this objection notice are:

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

The reasons for being so satisfied are that the location for the notice is currently covered by a Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) issued by Thurrock Council under section 59 of the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. This order restricts the consumption of alcohol in a defined area which include Grays Town Park and was issued to run from 1 April 2023 for a period of three years.

A Temporary Event Notice would enable the consumption of alcohol despite the presence of the PSPO allowing it the be undermined, the order was put in place due to the evidence from local resident and business of the misuse of public space and the disregard for the community and well-being of those in the area.



It is the opinion of Essex Police that the granting of the TEN for the area proposed would undermine the PSPO and give rise to the risk of crime and disorder, we therefor object to the granting of this Temporary Event Notice.

A copy of this objection notice has been served upon the premises user (or agent making application), the local Environmental Health Department and the relevant licensing authority.

On receipt of this notice the licensing authority will issue a 'Counter Notice' and provide further information on related procedures.

# THE THURROCK COUNCIL, Grays Riverside and Grays Thurrock wards

### **PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER 2023**

THE Thurrock Council (herein "the Council") makes this Order under Section 59 of the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014, having consulted as required by Section 72 of the Act.

The Order takes effect on 1 April 2023 and lasts for 3 years, until 31 March 2026.

1. It applies to the area within the following roads: Sherfield Road, from junction with Argent Street to crossing with Crown Road; Crown Road to Stanley Road; Stanley Road to Orsett Road; Orsett Road into London Road, into Hogg Lane, to Eastern Way; Eastern Way to Seally Road; Seally Road to London Road; London Road to Maidstone Road; Maidstone Road to Bruces Wharf Road; Bruces Wharf Road to Argent Street; Argent Street to Sherfield Road incorporating the Derby Road Bridge, Hampden Road including the alleyway parallel to Orsett Road and Bridge Road from Orsett Road to Argent Street.

This will be known as "The Restricted Area" and is outlined on the map attached to this document.

The Council is satisfied that activities have been carried out in this Restricted Area which have had a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality. Further, it is satisfied that the effect of these activities is, or is likely to be, of a persistent or continuing nature and is, or is likely to be, such as to make the activities unreasonable and the effect justifies the restrictions imposed.

The Council makes this Order as the following activities have been taking place:

- i. people have been gathering in The Restricted Area and acting in a manner causing annoyance, harassment, alarm and distress to those in the locality
- ii. the consumption of alcohol and other noxious substances, by those acting in a manner which is causing the annoyance, harassment, alarm and distress, is a prevailing factor

The activities have caused those living, working and visiting The Restricted Area to make complaints both to the Council and Police.

The Council and Police have also collated evidence from local residents and those who work in business situated in the designated area who state:

- public space is being misused
- there is disregard for community and personal well-being

These activities have given rise to nuisance and complaint to both the Council and the Police from local residents and businesses.

#### **Prohibitions**

# This Order creates the following prohibitions, pursuant to s59(4)(a) of the 2014 Act, in relation to The Restricted Area:

- 1. all drinking of alcohol and consummation of intoxicating substances including nitrous oxide for recreational use within the designated area
- 2. being verbally abusive to any person or behaving in a way which causes or is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to another person
- 3. no urination in a public place other than within designated public toilets
- 4. no spitting in a Public Place

# This Order creates the following requirements, pursuant to s59(4)(b) of the 2014 Act, in relation to The Restricted Area.

In The Restricted Area, a person commits an offence if without reasonable excuse he or she fails to comply with any action they are required to undertake at the request of an authorised officer, namely:

- a) leave The Restricted Area when required to do so by an authorised officer and not return within 48 hours, save for the exceptions set out below, or
- b) surrender any alcohol or intoxicating substances, including nitrous oxide in his or her possession when required to do so by an authorised officer

An "authorised officer" is any Police Officer, Police Community Support Officer, or an officer designated by the Council.

## **Exceptions**

A person may return within 48 hours for the purpose of attending the following locations:

- a. their residence, if it is within The Restricted Area
- b. appointments with the Probation Service
- c. appointments with Drug and Alcohol Services
- d. appointments at Thurrock Council Offices
- e. attendance at South Essex College
- f. directed to attend Grays Police Station, Brooke Road, Grays by an "authorised officer"

Failure, without reasonable excuse, to comply with the prohibitions or requirements imposed by this Order is a summary offence under section 67 of the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act, 2014. A person guilty of an offence under Section 67 is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale. A constable or an authorised person may, under Section 68 of the Act, issue a fixed penalty notice to anyone he or she has reason to believe has committed an offence under section 67 in relation to this Order.
